Approval of minutes

A motion to approve the April 24, 2023 minutes was made by Mr. Andrews and seconded by Mr. Milleville, all in favor, motion carried.

New Business/Public Hearings

Mr. Billingsley read the Public Hearing Notices.

DEGUEHERY, Thomas 4895 Shawnee Rd., Sanborn Special Permit-Animal Husbandry

ZSP-2023-006 SBL#106.00-1-6.42

Mr. Deguehery would like to have chickens for his children. They would be kept in a $10 \times 10^{\circ}$ shed and have a $40 \times 8^{\circ}$ enclosed run.

Public hearing was open.

A motion to approve the Special Permit to house chickens but no roosters for one year was made by Mr. Andrews and seconded by Ms. Shoop, all in favor, motion carried.

TURNER PROP./MODERN-TEC 4935 Lockport Rd., Lockport Area Variance- Wind Turbine ZBAV-2023-008 SBL#121.00-2-73

Padma Kasthurirangan from Buffalo Renewables explained that the 250 Kw wind turbine is to offset the energy use for the property owner. They are requesting a 1x total setback rather than the required 1.5x and to remove the setback required from the owner's buildings. Ms. Kasthurirangan went through the five variance criteria and her reasoning for how those criteria are met in this case. (The full description is attached to these minutes.) She also referenced cell towers in the area for comparison to other structures that do not meet the setbacks and have posed no security issues to date but have been up for years.

Mr. Billingsley stated that a Special Permit was previously granted to owner Chris Matyas for his business and that the turbine would be used for his business with net metering.

Public hearing was opened.

Public hearing was closed.

Ms. Kasthurirangan stated that ice on the turbine will cause the turbine blades to be off balance and therefore it will not run in icy conditions so there's no risk of ice flying off the turbine. It also has breaks and monitoring capabilities.

Mr. Billingsley explained that Wendel Engineers are looking further into SEQR regarding the turbine and he recommends that both the Planning and Zoning Boards meet on the same night in June to collaborate on the Site Plan and Special Permit.

Mr. Billingsley advised the Board that they can act on the Area Variance request or wait for more information. An Issue the Planning Board had was that the turbine is too close to the property line and that Mr. Matyas has two parcels that need to be combined. Ms. Kasthurirangan provided paperwork to Mr. Billingsley at the meeting where Mr. Matyas agrees to combine his two parcels.

Ms. Kasthurirangan explains that the total height is 176' to the tip of the blade. She provided an example of a turbine located in Tonawanda that is near buildings there. She provided a letter of recommendation from the owner of that turbine stating that the proximity has not been a problem. (Letter is attached to these minutes).

Mr. Billingsley recommended board members could do a site visits if they choose. There are also wetlands on the property and he recommends no action be taken until next month's meeting.

Ms. Kasthurirangan asked that a decision on area variance be made as there is a June 30 deadline for the NYS grant.

A motion to approve the area variance was made by Mr. Andrews and seconded by Mr. Milleville, all in favor, motion carried.

Re: Wind Energy Project proposal for Modern Tec Mfg at 4935 Lockport Rd, Lockport, NY 14094 To whom it may concern,

I am Ken Rawe Jr. P.E. B.S. Civil/Environmental Engineer. I was a partner in Oakgrove Construction Inc., a Heavy Highway and Bridge Contractor for 35 years, retiring in 2010. In 2010, I formed Triad Recycling and Energy Corp, a Construction and Demolition Debris Recycling company with 2 partners. Triad is located at 3755 river road, Tonawanda, NY 14150.

We powered our crushers, grinders and screeners with electric generated by two 100 kW wind turbines installed by Buffalo Renewables. Installed on 120' self-supported monopole towers, each system is 160' high to the tip of the blade. The first of these turbines, installed in 2016, is sited approximately 90' from our C&D processing building. The tower does not pose any safety concerns to our operations or the building(s) on site.

The 2 turbines together generate 320,000 kWh a year and helped us eliminate our demand charge completely saving us over \$40,000.00 in energy costs per year. Based on my experience, I highly support the proposed wind energy project by Buffalo Renewables for Modern Tec Manufacturing. I would be willing to arrange a tour of the facility for the town of Cambria's various board members, if interested.
