Following salute to the flag, Supervisor Ellis opened the public hearing on the Replacement in kind maintenance of existing sewer-line being approximately 845 L.F. of new 8" PVC sewer-line from existing SMH-23 to proposed SMH-27 and approximately 115 L.F. of new 10" PVC sewer-line from proposed SMH-27 to existing NCSD SMH-8, all in the Fair Village in the Town of Cambria.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE at its Regular Meeting to be held at the Town Hall, 4160 Upper Mountain Road, Sanborn, New York on the 13th day of April, 2023, the Town Board of the Town of Cambria, New York will conduct a public hearing at 7:00 PM on a certain Map, Plan and Report and an estimate of costs relating to replacement in kind maintenance of existing sewer-line being approximately 845 L.F. of new 8" PVC sewer-line from existing SMH-23 to proposed SMH-27 and approximately 115 L.F. of new 10" PVC sewer-line from proposed SMH-27 to existing NCSD SMH-8, all in the Fair Village in the Town of Cambria as shown in the Map, Plan and Report proposed by Wendel (Engineers and Architects) for the Town of Cambria Sewer District of said Town at an estimated maximum cost of \$325,000.00 and environmental consideration in connection therewith under SEQRA, at which time and place the Town Board will hear all persons interested. A copy of said Map, Plan and Report and estimate of cost is on file in the office of the Town Clerk where the same may be examined by interested persons during regular business hours.

Tim Walck, Wendel reported that this section of sewer runs from Unicorn Drive to Fair Village and ties into the Niagara County Sewer District. This has been identified for some time as a replacement item and therefore it is considered a maintenance project. Wendel's recommendation is that this is a Type II action under SEQR, which means SEQR is not applicable.

This project has been submitted to the Niagara County Health Department for review and the next step, if approved, will be to proceed to Public Bidding. American Rescue Plan Funds and Funds from NCSD are expected to be used to fund and or reimburse for this project.

Fair Village Bond Resolution

BOND RESOLUTION DATED APRIL 13, 2023

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT IN KIND MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING SEWER-LINE BEING APPROXIMATELY 845 L.F. OF NEW 8" PVC SEWER-LINE FROM EXISTING SMH-23 TO PROPOSED SMH-27 AND APPROXIMATELY 115 L.F. OF NEW 10" PVC SEWER-LINE FROM PROPOSED SMH-27 TO EXISTING NCSD SMH-8, ALL IN THE FAIR VILLAGE IN THE TOWN OF CAMBRIA AS SHOWN IN THE MAP, PLAN AND REPORT PROPOSED BY WENDEL (ENGINEERS AND ARCHITECTS) FOR THE TOWN OF CAMBRIA SEWER DISTRICT OF SAID

TOWN AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$325,000.00 AND THE FINANCING OF SAME THROUGH THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS

WHEREAS, pursuant to proceedings hereto had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Section 202-b of the Town Law, the Town Board of the Town of Cambria, Niagara County, New York, has determined it to be in the public interest to increase and improve facilities of the Cambria Sewer District in the Town of Cambria, and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize replacement in kind maintenance of existing sewer-line being approximately 845 L.F. of new 8" PVC sewer-line from existing SMH-23 to proposed SMH-27 and approximately 115 L.F. of new 10" PVC sewer-line from proposed SMH-27 to existing NCSD SMH-8, all in the Fair Village in the Town of Cambria as shown in the Map, Plan and Report proposed by Wendel (Engineers and Architects) for the Town of Cambria Sewer District of said Town at an estimated maximum cost of \$325,000.00 and the financing of same through the issuance of Bonds, and

WHEREAS, as the PROJECT IS A SEQRA TYPE II Action, there is no adverse environmental impact resulting from this project, no negative or positive environmental impact statement is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Cambria, Niagara County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The replacement in kind maintenance of existing sewer-line being approximately 845 L.F. of new 8" PVC sewer-line from existing SMH-23 to proposed SMH-27 and approximately 115 L.F. of new 10" PVC sewer-line from proposed SMH-27 to existing NCSD SMH-8, all in the Fair Village in the Town of Cambria as shown in the Map, Plan and Report proposed by Wendel (Engineers and Architects) for the Town of Cambria Sewer District of said Town at an estimated maximum cost of \$325,000.00 for the Town of Cambria and environmental consideration in connection therewith under SEQRA, in and for the Town of Cambria, together with the necessary accoutrements is hereby authorized.

<u>Section 2.</u> The maximum estimated cost of such specific object or purpose is \$325,000.00 and the plan for the financing thereof is \$325,000.00 by the issuance of the serial bonds of the Town of Cambria hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law. Further details pertaining to the said bonds will be prescribed in a further resolution or resolutions of this Town Board.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is thirty years, pursuant to subdivision 4 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the serial bonds herein authorized will not exceed five years.

<u>Section 4.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. The faith and credit of Town of Cambria, Niagara County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. There shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land within the Town of Cambria Sewer District No. 1 which the Town shall determine and specify to be especially benefitted by the improvement, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same become due, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property in the Town of Cambria shall be subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

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- 1. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town of Cambria is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3. Such obligations are not authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 7.</u> Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in full in the Union Sun & Journal, the official newspaper, together with a notice of the Town Clerk, in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Upon a motion duly made by Councilman Foe and seconded by Councilman Hurtgam it was resolved to approve the Bond Resolution for Fair Village Sewer Project dated April 13, 2023.

- Bear Ridge Solar Project-still waiting on the decision from the executive director of renewable energy siting.
- Free Paint Drop off April 15th 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Niagara University Dwyer Ice Arena Parking Lot. There is a pre-registration requirement.
- In receipt of a letter from the Association of Towns asking for support for an incentive based approach to affordable housing in order to maintain local control over local zoning.
- Working with AFLAC to give the Town employees an opportunity to participate.
- Some remediation going on at the old air force station on Rt. 31 and Shawnee Rd.

CONCERNS OF CITIZENS

Sharon Tasner-Subbera Rd.

Ms. Tasner is concerned about dogs being allowed to run at large unleashed at the Town Park by their owners.

Supervisor Ellis indicated that the Town has a leash law and the Town Board is aware of this problem and is currently working on addressing the issue regarding unleashed dogs at the park.

Ms. Tasner announced a meat raffle fundraiser for the Cambria Opposition Group to be held on May 5th at the Knights of Columbus Hall on Erie Ave. in NT. Pelicano's will be providing the meat.

MOUNT VIEW CEMETERY RULES/REGULATIONS/FEE SCHEDULE

Supervisor Ellis indicated that changes to the cemetery rules and regulations haven't been made since 2017 and they were in need up updating. Some of the fees have been changed to keep in line with the other local Niagara County cemeteries. The Town has also made a cremains garden in a location of the cemetery that will not allow for deeper graves.
